Volunteer Activity Plan

There are a number of volunteer activities that can contribute to our mission as a passed state to **"Build an engaged army of self-governing grassroots activists"**.

This document will assist you in helping to define and participate in local and State government, civic and private community and business affairs. In essence we need our Volunteers to be the "eyes, ears and voice" to learn about what's happening in their respective communities. Each Volunteer is asked to pass on opportunities they discover (presentations, table top informational activity, etc.) to their District Captain or COS leadership personnel. State leadership and District Captains will then determine how, when and with what resources to proceed. All District Volunteers will be asked to participate.

Here are some ideas and areas for Volunteers to investigate:

- Church groups
- Political party activities locally, such as county party meetings and events. Please remember the COS is nonpartisan and we do not endorse candidates or parties. We are an "open tent"!
- Veteran groups and organizations
- Law enforcement and first responder organizations
- Local newspapers and radio stations
- Car and motorcycle clubs
- Shooting galleries, gun clubs and gun shows
- Impact organizations such as the local Chamber of Commerce and other professional organizations
- Table top petition drives stationed in public properties where allowed, libraries, public parks, nature centers, civic centers, shopping centers, etc.
- Never miss an opportunity to recruit family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, customers/clients and suppliers

- Large amateur athletic events like baseball, soccer, football, softball, tennis, hockey, volleyball tournaments
- HOA and community clubs

When attending any of these events look for opportunities to identify yourself as a Convention of States supporter and whether the club, organization, group etc. would be willing to have someone from the Convention of State leadership team make a presentation about our efforts. Also, if you learn of ordinances or policies being proposed that are intrusive and inconsistent with citizen's liberty let someone in the Convention of States Arizona leadership know so that we might determine if it is something we may wish to officially oppose.
