Washington is broken.

HOW IT WORKS:

Thirty-four states pass resolutions with the same subject matter for a convention of states.

The states elect delegates, known as commissioners, to represent them at the convention. States send as many delegates as they choose, but each state gets one vote.

Delegates propose, debate, and vote on amendments at the convention based on their resolution. Proposed amendments passed by a majority of state delegates are sent to the states for ratification.

When 38 states ratify a proposed amendment, it becomes part of the Constitution.
